About the lecture:

This talk provides a historical perspective on internal and international migration associated with India and links it with contemporary issues such as social values, federalism, nativism, urbanization and linguistic politics. Starting from the middle of the 19th century, many parts of India have experienced 'The Great Indian Migration Wave' that continues till date, affecting the fortunes of hundreds of millions of Indians in selected migration corridors and in places outside India. Which are these places? How do people see migration and migrants? What is the future of migration in India? These are some of the issues addressed by the talk.

About the speaker:

Chinmay Tumble is passionate about migration, cities and history, and is currently a faculty member in the Economics Area at the Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad. An alumnus of the London School of Economics and Political Science, the Indian Institute of Management Bangalore; Ruia College, Mumbai; and Rishi Valley School, Madanapalle, he has been a faculty member at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Hyderabad. He was a 2013 Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute, Florence, and the 2018 Alfred D. Chandler Jr. International Visiting Scholar in Business History at Harvard Business School, Boston. His first book, *India Moving: A History of Migration*, was published in 2018 and second book *The Age of Pandemics, 1817-1920: How they shaped India and the World*, was published in 2020. He is a member of the *The Lancet* Covid-19 India Taskforce and was a member of the Working Group on Migration of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation in 2016-17. He has published widely in leading journals and newspapers and helped set up the IIMA Archives.
